 - Enforcement of street and garage parking fees begins September 7
 - Lion Bash is scheduled for September 9th from 5:00 to 8:00 pm on Allen Street
 - Borough will conduct a needs survey for distribution of funds for small business grants and loans
 - County small business loans are available through application
 - Reconstitution of the State College Downtown Improvement District will be up for voting by property owners later this year; 60 percent of business owners must agree to the tax in support of reconstitution
- 6. Other items and discussion:
 - Borough will receive 13.2 million dollars from the American Recovery Plan Act; allocation of funds will support capital improvement and economic recovery from COVID
 - COVID-19: Masks are now required in the Borough Building and strongly encouraged for all persons in all public buildings; State College Area School District will require masks for all students, faculty and staff
 - Annual HCA fall election meeting is uncertain at this time based on COVID issues for indoor group gatherings
