3. E Fairmount Park Project Updates:

- A recent meeting was held on-site to initiate a landscape watering plan to augment the weekly rain cycle.
- The completion of landscape plantings will follow the proposed walking path development.
- Funding sources are slow in arriving delaying the placement of playground equipment and completion of the project. Project completion expected by spring 2022.

5. Borough Updates:

- NEAT (Neighborhood Enforcement Alcohol Team) made up of two Borough and two Penn State police officers have committed to enforce neighborhood alcohol-inspired violations revolving around large sports gatherings on Thursday through Saturday this fall.
- The Borough Police Department's staffing goal is complete at 60 officers.
- Connectivity, a State College Downtown Improvement District project for Calder Way, promotes family activities such as creative lighting shows, live music, and family-friendly movies Thursday through Saturday beginning Thursday, July 15th.
- A new Borough position has been created to engage in and respond to mental health, alcohol, drug and equity issues.

6. Other items and discussion:

- As part of the Highlands welcome to new neighbors, Margaret Sebastianelli, Helen Kearney, Nina White and Kirsten Jensen provide an HCA tote with print materials highlighting regional activities and opportunities.
